A Word from our Pro – Drew Calver

Demo Days – Thank-you to all that came out and supported the Titleist Club Fitting day earlier this month. For those still interested in a club fitting, representatives from Cobra Golf will be visiting at the end of the month (Friday, June 30).

While there continues to be technological advances in clubs and balls, the key piece of technology to club fitting is the launch monitor. The distance a golf ball travels will depend on the speed of the ball and the time it spends in the air. Ball speed is a function of swing speed and contact efficiency and therefore depends on ability, yet optimum launch conditions to keep the ball in the air can be defined using a launch monitor. Slow, medium, and fast swing speeds require a different launch angle and spin rate to optimize ball flight.

This can be especially important when purchasing new equipment but can also benefit those with existing clubs featuring adjustable hosel settings and moveable weights. A properly tuned driver can help eliminate those wayward tee shots and lead to lower scores.
